Annual Report — 20 Year Look

Happy Winter, to all,

The Holiday Season has just passed, the depth of winter has enveloped us, and dreams of spring and flowers and warm sun (and bicycling, for me) abound. I trust this newsletter finds you in good health.

Typically, the newsletter reminds us of the programs we have held, the content of the share sessions, the nature of our membership, and so on. So, I will do that, but, briefly. We hosted programs about Greenville Center; Ted Hilscher's photographic history of buildings on Main Street, Catskill, that no longer exist; photo selections for the calendar; and, of course, the celebration of the first calendar in four years.

Our share sessions, which tend to alternate with programs, contained a wealth of information; subscribers are kept up to date on a monthly basis.

I often copy recent articles of the nearby area or documents that pertain to our local history. These included, this year, topics such as restaurant reviews, genealogy requests, the continuation of the Howard Taylor mystery (well, it was a mystery to us, for a long while), personal recognitions in the newspapers, King Hill Church records, Vernon Haskins material about the Catskill Creek Valley, write-ups about local areas from a variety of newspapers, ghost stories, railroad history, and other topics that fascinate the historical-minded.

The photo exhibits in January (buildings, streets, and aerials) and Febru-

ary (people and families) showed our community about 125 photos that have not been seen publicly before.

The challenges remain the same. We should try to record those slices of history we care about, as well as those slices that have import; to share this history; to use this history when a good decision is made better for knowing our background; to encourage wise historical preservation; to influence those political decisions that affect our history; and to continue to relish and delight in the company of like-minded people.

As the town's historian, I look forward to your continued support. I also respect those efforts that also support historical purposes, even if we don't directly connect, at times.

So, is this brief enough? I hope so because I want to try something different. 2009 marks my 20th year as Town Historian. Although I have had the liberty of defining my own course most of the time, an outsider would obviously see the influence that all of you have had on me and my performance. Almost everything I have done as Town Historian I have shared with you, usually directly. Many of the projects I have undertaken have been furthered by your assistance. Our meetings have enabled people to further projects or just simply to enjoy what we have lived.

After perusing the start of the newsletters in June 1989, I thought it useful to summarize what we have done. So, month by month, I have listed the program or

share session, and the major points. Nearly 190 issues of newsletter have gone through the mail since its inception.

Simply, I have an immense sense of pride and achievement for what has been accomplished. I acknowledge that I have played a key role in this but anyone reading this knows that all of us together have created or recaptured slices of our history that will affect what people know or will remember in the coming years. Flashes of memories come back upon a re-reading of our newsletters. I thank you for your help, kind indulgences, and gentle constructive reminders of other "truths." I hope I have been an adept instigator and recorder of our stories.

My re-reading emphasized the stark recognition of the passing of people, and of the influence and joy they engendered. So many good memories, so many pangs of wanting one more time to talk to the people who meant so much. I want to hear Edna Adams and her support (she was the Town Historian the eight years before me); Toot Vaughn's stories about Greenville; Claribel and Len Gardiner's accounts about so many things local; Gerald Ingalls' way of telling a story, and then another; Ray Beecher's low key, but academic, width of area history; Lillian Weeks' pride in King Hill; Orlie Bear's rolling of one story into the next; Ray and Marge Bennett's everyday account of life; Cris Ketcham's determination to preserve her church; Alice Roe's understated telling of her life stories; Chris McDonald's love of life and stories; Leona Rundell's clarity of details at just the time I needed her to explain her mother's diary; Phil Ellis' rambling insights; Doris Hempstead's monthly visits and genealogy background; and the list is easily twice this long. I have appreciated all these efforts and memories, and miss them all. Please accept my apologies if I did not mention someone I should have.

So, here it is. Twenty years of our efforts, even as long as it is, shortened to keep it readable. I wish I could have included every name, but I think I have included the major points.
